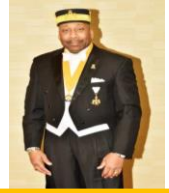

Science versus Speculation

Our faith is tested at many levels, yet we as Scottish Rite Masons know that our actions are guided by a higher Being and place our faith in those things not seen and sometimes untested. We enter 2021 with the effects of COVID-19 having taken the lives of greater than 350,000 American lives as of this writing. A disproportionate amount of people of black and brown hue has been afflicted and succumb to the effects of this pandemic. A multiplicity of events has allowed this pandemic to spiral to this current level, lack of leadership, political, miseducation and misdirection as well as racial and economic bias. Let's just be open, we as a people have not had a positive experience with medical science. We know about smallpox in blankets, non-treatment of men with syphilis, utilizing the cells of family members for scientific advancement without permission of the family just to recall a few of the indiscretions. It is not without warrant for our population to view this pandemic with skepticism. The origin of this aspect of corona virus is in question as to why we did not isolate and control the breakout when we were first made aware in December 2019. Again, a manifestation of politics and misdirection.

Let's define vaccine, a biological preparation that provides active acquired immunity to a particular infectious disease. You are given in a vaccination a particle which allows your own immune system to make defenses which will stop or reduce the effects of the infectious disease. You CANNOT get the disease from the vaccination. You can have reactions to the items which make up the vaccine especially if you are a highly allergic person. Most just have muscle aches at the injection site, possible low-grade fever, stomach upset. Therefore these vaccines are first tried in a diverse population to determine what works and what does not. The COVID-19 vaccine was generated by advances in science and DNA engineering which in the past would have taken years to produce. These methods have allowed for a vaccine to be brought forward in a timely and effective process. No steps were skipped, no corners cut. Yes, it was approved by the FDA under Emergency Use Authorization because the testing up to December 2020 demonstrated that the benefit was better than the risk of not getting a method to control the spread of the disease.

We are hit the hardest and suffer the severest consequences of this disease. We have a disproportionate effect of hypertension, diabetes and obesity in our people. A good percentage of our population have poor dietary habits and diminished opportunity for healthy food options in our communities. There are many methods to address the problems listed yet that is not the purpose of this article. As of this writing there are two vaccines authorized within the United States for distribution, Pfizer-BioTech and Moderna. Others will follow as they complete their clinical trials. Yes, I got the vaccine on Wednesday, 30 December 2020. My hospital received the Pfizer version. I accepted the vaccine because of three things, I am an anesthesiologist, and I am potentially exposed every day of my vocation, I have a few of those pre-existing conditions and COVID-19 has affected my household. So, for me the benefit outnumbers the risk. I will not tell you what to do, I can only share my story. I believe the science and not the speculation. I expect each of my Fraters to read trustworthy sources, speak with your medical team, evaluate the information and make the appropriate decision for your household and your wellbeing. COVID-19 is real and potentially lethal. Fraters use what you know and not what you heard. The life you save maybe your own or someone in your immediate family. I am encouraging all Scottish Rite Masons to embrace the science and dispense with the speculation.

Happenings Around the Orient

On November 5, 2020 PCIC / GIG Matthew Bonham of C.L. Mathews Commanders of the Rite and Jacob Harrison Consistory #85 was elected as Executive at Large for the Columbus Chapter of the NAACP. As an Executive at Large he is a member of the Executive Committee which has general control of the affairs and programs of the chapter, subject to the authority of the chapter and the provisions of the Constitution and approved bylaws. In the case of Branches, Executive Committees shall appoint, employ and enter into employment arrangements with employees of the Unit subject only to employment procedures and qualifications approved by the National Office.

The Executive Committee renders a report, containing the reports of all standing and special committees, at the regular meetings of the chapter and whenever otherwise required.

The Executive Committee is responsible for approving the Chapter President's appointments of Chairpersons of the various Standing Committees as presented by the President.

Other duties of the Executive Committee are:

- To create special committees as needs arise.

- To fill all vacancies in Chapter offices and on the Executive Committee.

- To decide matters of Chapter policy subject to endorsement by the Chapter and in accordance with national policy.

The Standing Committees of the Branch shall be: **Afro-Academic, Cultural, Technological and Scientific Olympics (ACT-SO)**, Armed Services & Veteran Affairs; Communications, Press & Publicity; Community Coordination; Criminal Finance; Freedom Fund; Health; Housing; Labor & Industry; Legal Redress; Membership and Life Membership; Political Action; Prison Branch; Religious Affairs; Young Adult; Youth Works; and **Women in the NAACP (WIN)**

Illustrious Bonham also serves as the DDGM for the Columbus 4th Masonic District of the MWPHGLGA.

Sovereign Grand Commander Dr. Deary Vaughn



Dr. Deary Vaughn was born on November 21, 1936 in Rocky Mount, North Carolina to Laura Robberson Hines Vaughn and Elijah Vaughn. He was the oldest sibling of three brothers and one sister. Deary graduated from Phillips high school in Brattleboro, North Carolina in 1955. This post-secondary education included community college of the Air Force, University of Nebraska, Conyers state college, and North Eastern State University. He graduated from a noncommissioned officers Air Force Academy and held an Honorary Doctorate in Humanities from liberty Baptist college.

At an early age, his parents taught him a love of his Savior and his devotion to God, shaping his personal integrity, honor and commitment to humanitarianism and excellence. He was a faithful member of the Hainerberg Chapel Wiesbaden, West Germany and later in life and until his passing was a member of the Antioch Missionary Baptist Church in Muskogee, Oklahoma where he served as chairman of the Board of Trustees, membership committee chair and vice president of the usher board.

He joined the United States Army in 1954 and immediately opted instead to serve his country and the United States Air Force in 1955. While serving the United States Armed Forces, he was assigned tours all over the United States and Europe, his final duty station was Tinker Air Force Base where he retired as a Command Master Sergeant After 33 Years of Service. Still wanting to serve he began working for the Disabled American Veterans Association as a service officer until his retirement in 1991.

From picture-perfect photographer in the Air Force, to dynamic service officer, to Masonic devotion his humble service and charity shined in all he did. He was The Master Mason and served the fraternal order as the Sovereign Grand Commander of the Southern Jurisdiction, Scottish Rite Masons, Prince Hall affiliation until his departure. He also served as Grand Master, for the jurisdiction of Oklahoma for 30 years. He served at every level of masonry and held every leadership position that the paternity offered.

The void of his loss will be felt by family, friends and loved ones.
